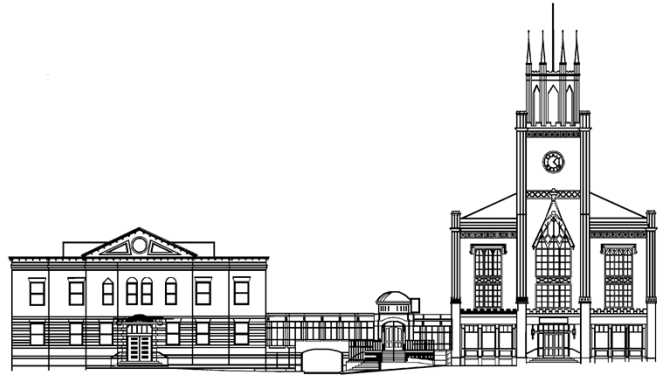

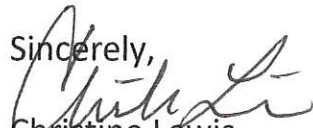

To the Public Safety and Traffic Committee:

In an effort to improve neighborhood environmental conditions and cleanliness the Department of Public Works is proposing a pilot sweeping program. The key point of the pilot is set sweeping schedule for defined area. This will allow for more consistent cleaning of the area, better neighborhood communication, and more efficient sweeping operations.

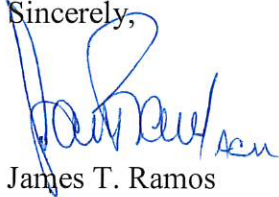
The schedule for the pilot area will be once a month for eight times per year from the beginning of April through the end of November. The pilot area will be ten centerline miles of roadway for twenty curb miles of sweeping. The pilot area (see attached map) is bounded by Valley Street on the south to Auburn Street on the north, and Pine Street on the west to Wilson Street on the East. Sweeping will take place on the first Wednesday and Thursday of the month. One side of a street will be swept per day allowing the other side of the street to remain available for resident parking. To improve neighborhood communication, new permanent signage shall be installed. One side of the road shall have signage stating, "No Parking First Wednesday of the Month April through November" and the other side of the road will have signage stating, "No Parking First Thursday of the Month April through November".

To improve neighborhood communication, in addition to the new permanent signage, the Department of Public works will utilize Nixle alerts and social media for notifications. Each

month Nixle alerts shall be used to notify the residents of the upcoming sweeping. Manchester Police Department will also send out this alert on their social media to increase distribution. In the event weather will not permit sweeping of the area for the scheduled day, Nixle and social media will be used to notify the area that sweeping will have to be delayed.

If approved, the Department of Public Works, plans to run this pilot for the 2022 Street Sweeping season. At which point, an evaluation will be made to the improvement of the environmental conditions and sweeping efficiency of the pilot area.

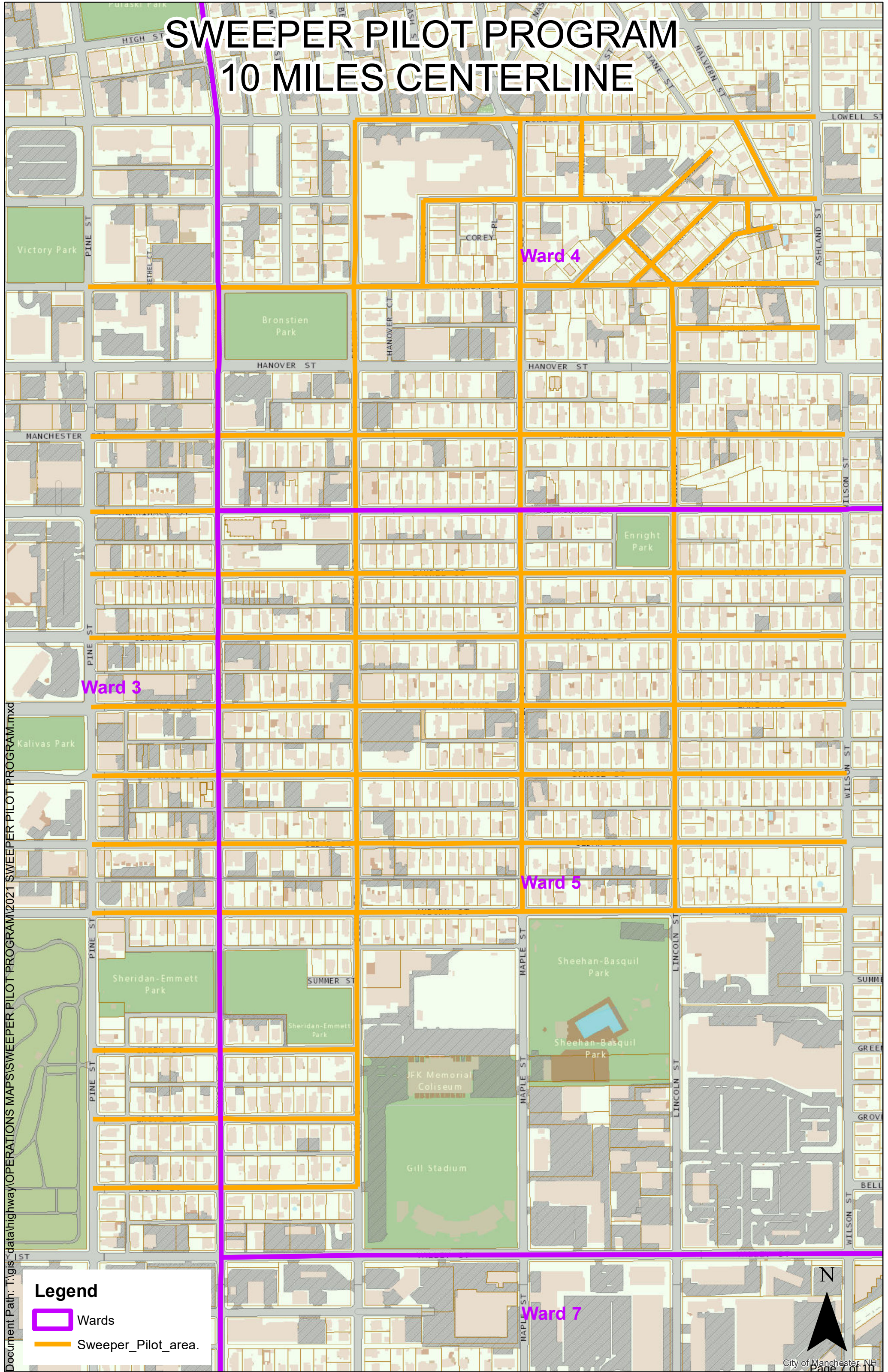

Re: Request for waiver of fee for police detail

Dear fellow Aldermen,

I received communication from Mr. Daniel Mowery, my constituent in Ward 6 at 112 Holt Ave, regarding a Christmas holiday block party that him, his neighbors and a few other people are looking to organize at and around his residence on Sunday, December 12, 2021, between 4:00 pm and 6:00 pm. The purpose of the block party is to raise funds, which will be donated to Toys for Tots, Station 8 Fire and the Manchester homeless population, while enjoying a holiday gathering for children and their families.

Mr. Mowery previously held a successful gathering on August 15, 2021, and the attendees raised over \$1,100 for the Manchester Mounted Patrol. Such block party was properly sanctioned, Mr. Mowery obtained all necessary permits, and the event was conducted without any issues.

Upon requesting a permit for the December 12 block party, Mr. Mowery was informed of a potential fee of \$500 for police detail for the gathering. Please note that Mr. Mowery has not requested that a police detail is present for the duration of the 2-hour event. Therefore, on his behalf, and in case the Manchester Police Department deems police detail necessary for this event, I respectfully request that the Board of Mayor and Aldermen waives the \$500 police detail fee as well as any other fee beyond standard fees payable to the city to obtain a permit.

This is an all-volunteer community gathering, and the attendees are looking to put together a successful fundraising effort for the abovementioned causes as well as provide an inviting atmosphere for neighbors and visitors.
