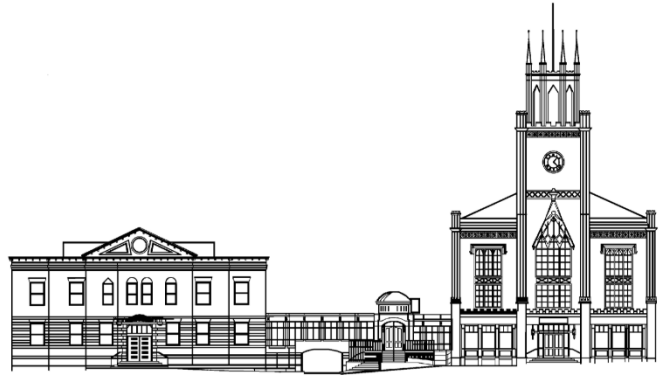

Since 1884, Webster House has been a home to children in the community when they need one most. From cooking classes to outdoor adventures, from goal-directed therapy to financial literacy education, we endeavor to help the children living at Webster House to grow healthier and more confident each day. Young people living at Webster House are learning skills needed to thrive in a complex world.

Webster House is a safe and predictable environment for some of New Hampshire's most vulnerable young people. Thanks to our generous donors, grantors, volunteers, and community partners, 2024 was a year of progress and growth. In 2024, we replaced broken fencing around the yard, creating a safer outdoor space to play and learn, and completed upgrades to our fire alarms, fire panel, and security cameras. A major milestone was that we earned a 3-year accreditation through CARF (Commission on Accreditation Rehabilitation Facilities).

In 2025, we continue to implement integral safety upgrades in the house, including a fire-suppression sprinkler system and new flooring in our residential living areas. Our staff are committed to making Webster House a comfortable and empowering home for every young person who comes to live here, whether their stay be for a few days or for a number of years. Our Board of Directors is invested in the needs of our residents today while also keeping an eye on our future growth and sustainability.

Thank you for taking the time to learn about our accomplishments in 2024. We look forward to nurturing relationships with our partners and community for years to come.

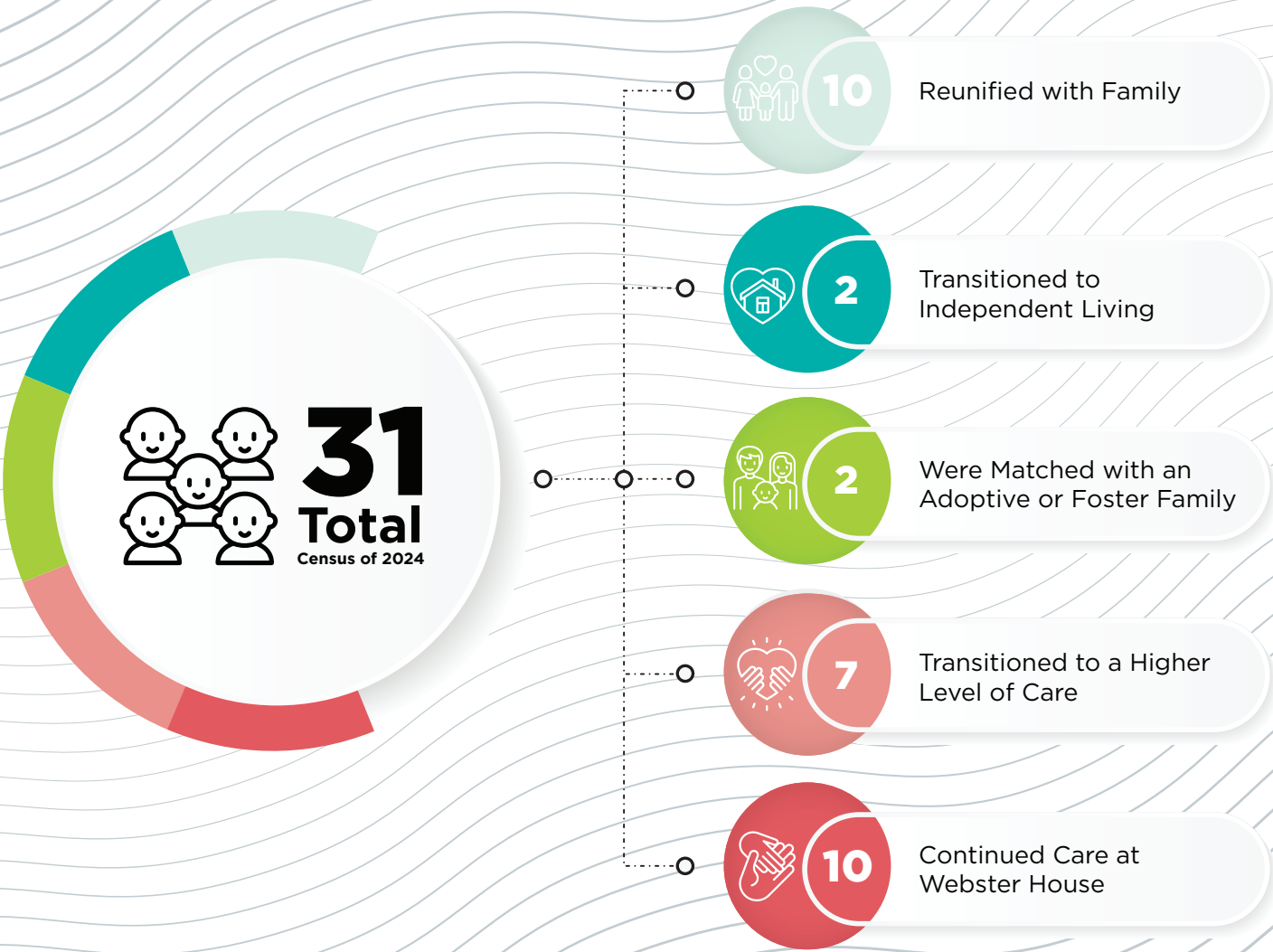

- Another is working in the community.



Driving Milestones

- Thanks to a scholarship award from the Penni Charitable Trust, driver's education was funded for one deserving resident.
- Three residents each began working toward obtaining a driving license.
- One youth completed a driving assessment with *Drivability*, a program focused on assessing readiness for driving of those with disabilities.

Cooking Classes

- Partially funded by FEEDNH, our independent living skills program offered residents regular opportunities to learn to create a menu and shopping list, budget for and buy groceries, and then prepare and share a meal together.
- Additional cooking class opportunities took place at Culinary Playground in Derry, NH and Tuscan Market in Salem, NH.



Academic Achievements

- Youth living at Webster House are planning for their futures, exploring career options such as nursing and cosmetology.
- One youth is attending Keene State College.

Community Spirit and Citizenship

- Two residents volunteered at Darbster Doggy, an animal rescue, and loved giving back to the community.
- The Webster House incentive program allowed youth living at the house to earn rewards for good citizenship and being kind to one another.



Summer Enrichment

- Made possible by generous donors, several residents participated in extended learning opportunities, including soccer camp, theatre camp at the Palace Theatre, and Camp Starfish.

Independent Living

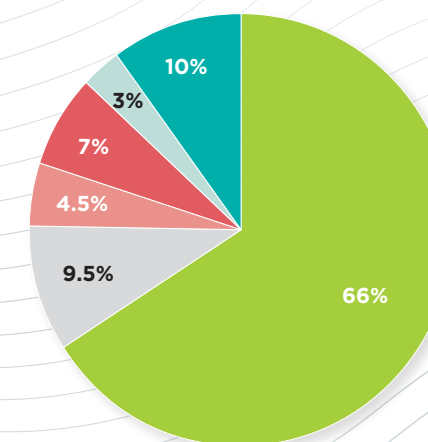
- One resident was hired for his first job, bought a new phone, and opened a bank account!

2024 Financials

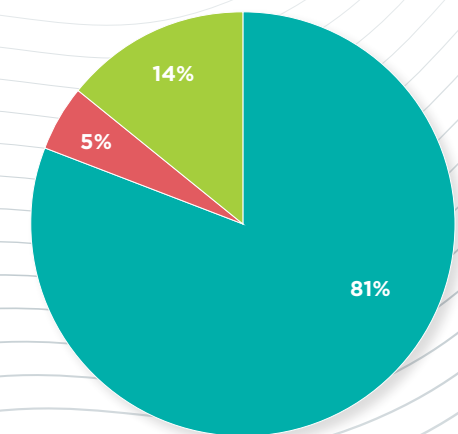

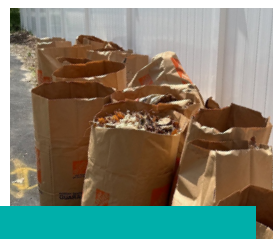

Greetings! Since 1884 Webster House has provided safety, support, and opportunity to New Hampshire's most vulnerable youth. Over the past year, we've been entrusted with the care of 24 young people, many of whom have no other home to return to. For them, Webster House is more than a place to stay; it's truly a home.

With grant funding we were able to make tangible improvements that increase the safety of our home including the implementation of a sprinkler system throughout, and flooring in the residential and office areas. In addition, we were able to secure a second Kia Carnival, and onboarded with a new security camera vendor. These initiatives greatly improve our program overall, as well as provide the comfort of a safe home for our residents.

Our residents, ages 8-20, are at pivotal moments in their development. This reality charges our staff not only with great responsibility, but with a profound opportunity to help shape brighter futures. Across seven generations, it's impossible to measure how many lives have been rescued, redirected, and renewed because of your generosity.

Where State Funding Ends, Your Generosity Begins

While Webster House receives state support for Medicaid and room & board, the state covers only about \$450 of the \$800 daily cost of care per child per day. Your contributions bridge that critical gap, ensuring that every young person receives the safety, therapy, education, and love they deserve.

\$150

allows us to celebrate milestones, providing birthday presents, cake, and recognition for school achievements and graduations.

\$250

ensures residents have seasonal essentials such as clothing, shoes, and personal care products to meet their needs year-round.

\$500

covers weekend, school break, and summer vacation activities like escape rooms, movie nights at Chunky's, bowling, visits to Canobie Lake Park, Boston outings, and more.

\$1,000

provides essential Independent Living Skills training for our residents, including driver's education, cooking classes, and community trips to foster independence.

\$2,500

transforms a resident's bedroom into a cozy, home-like space, offering comfort and security for each child.

\$5,000

helps fund major renovation and upgrade projects, such as refurbishing the recreation room or updating bathrooms to create a more welcoming environment.

You Kept the Lights On and Hope Alive

In 2025, your generosity made a lasting difference for 24 residents through individualized therapy, group support, education, life-skills programming such as:

- **Botvin LifeSkills Training:** an interactive prevention program proven to reduce substance use, violence, and other high-risk behaviors.
- **Therapeutic Crisis Intervention (TCI):** trauma informed care for physical interventions.
- **Community Connection Nights:** shared meals and dialogue among residents, mentors, family, and staff, giving residents the opportunity to invite relatives and friends.
- **Trust-Based Relational Intervention (TBRI) & trauma-informed care:** ensuring every staff member is equipped to provide compassionate, evidence-based support.
- **EQ2 Training:** strengthening the skills of staff who work with trauma-impacted youth.
- **Choose Love Curriculum:** cultivating emotional awareness, self-regulation, healthy relationships, and positive character traits.

		All youth residing at Webster House are required to participate in volunteer service throughout the year. Webster House partners with the Salvation Army to support weekly Kids Café programming, as well as seasonal initiatives such as holiday bell ringing and gift wrapping. In addition, residents volunteer with Darbster Kitty and Doggie and take part in community service efforts, including the Earth Day park cleanup at Livingston Park.
